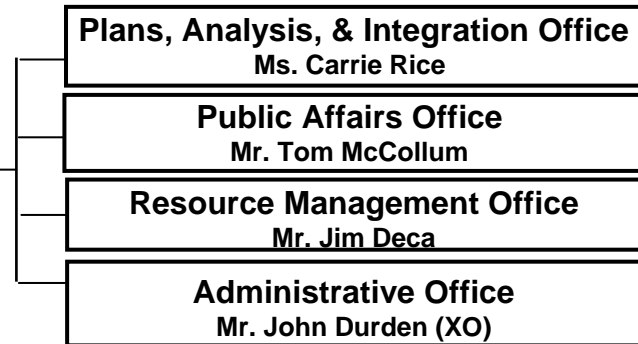
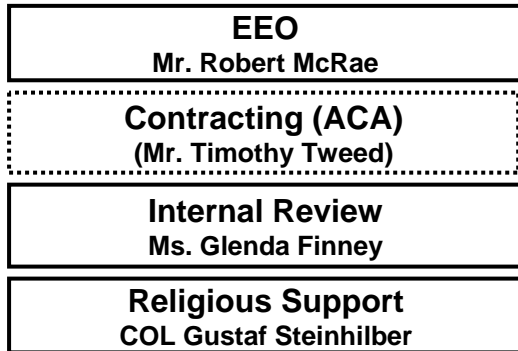
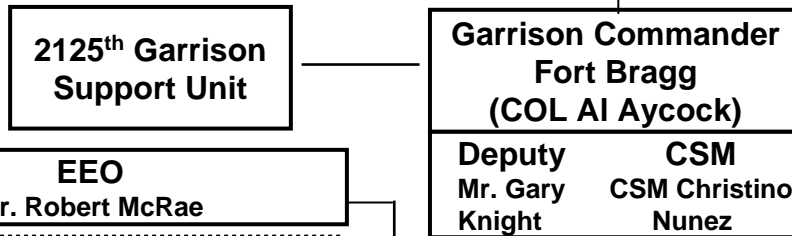
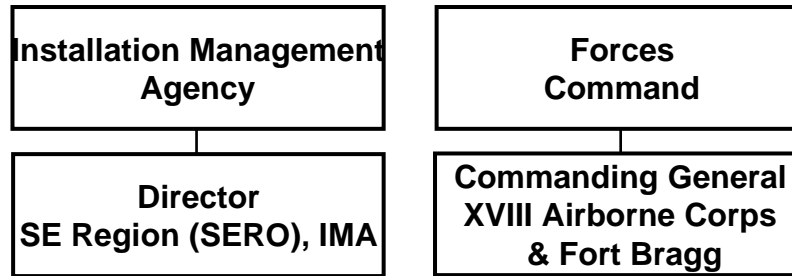


INSTALLATION CHALLENGES

- Increased positive findings from 2 in 2000 to 13 in 2005 (the highest in the Army)

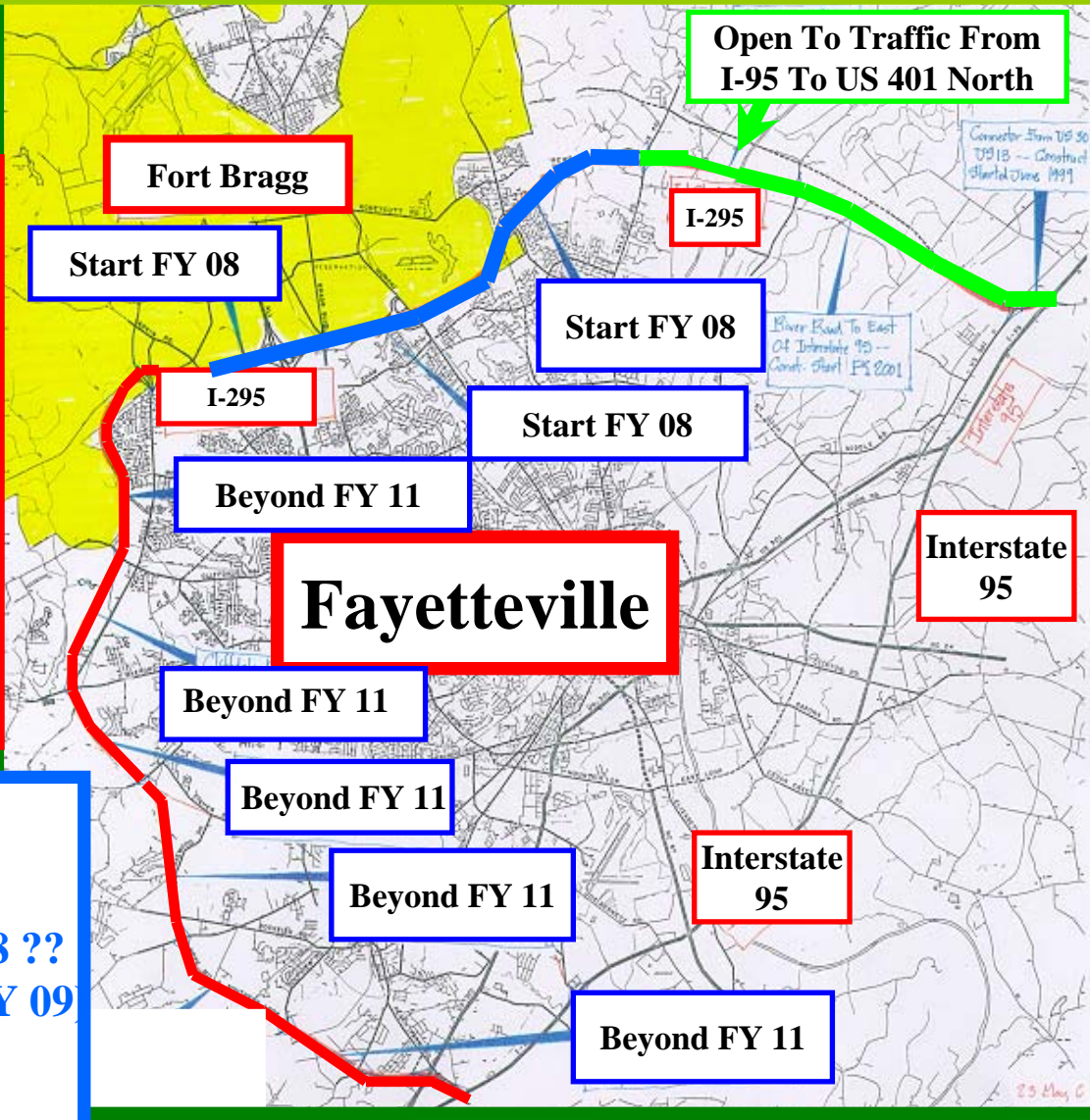

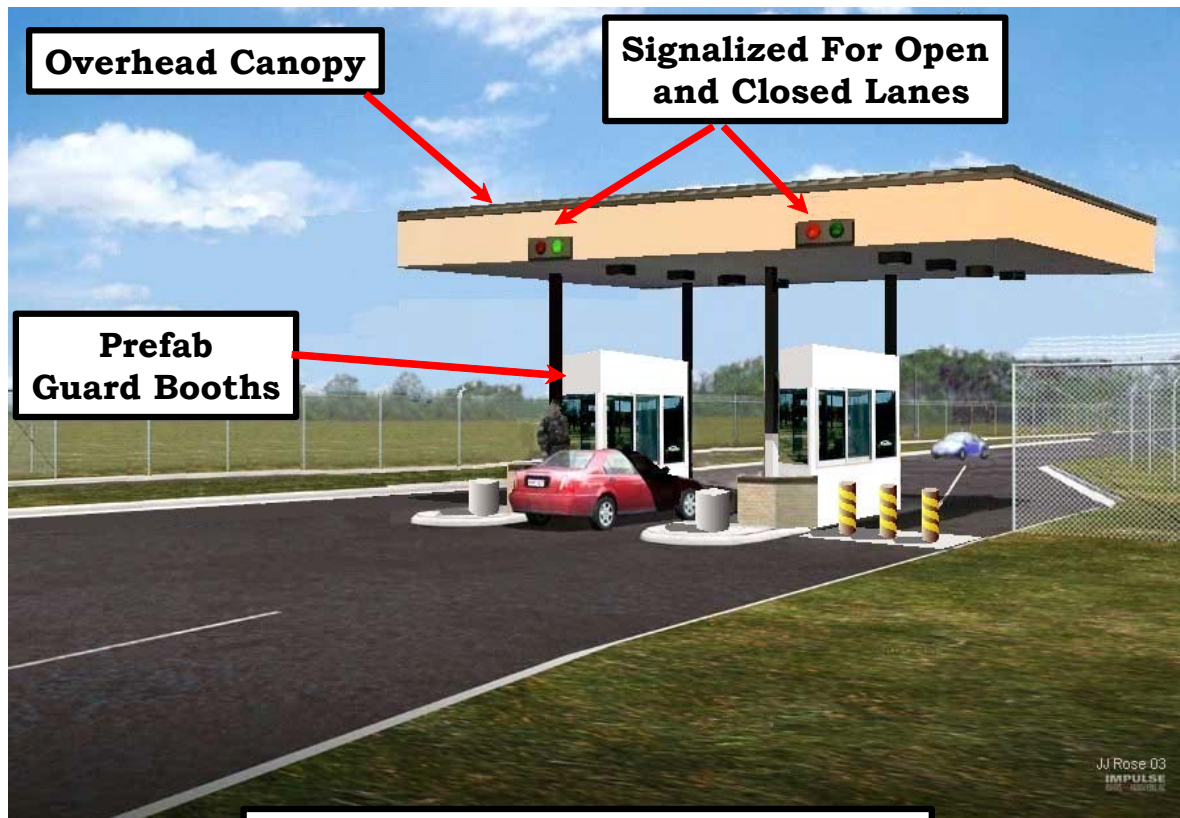

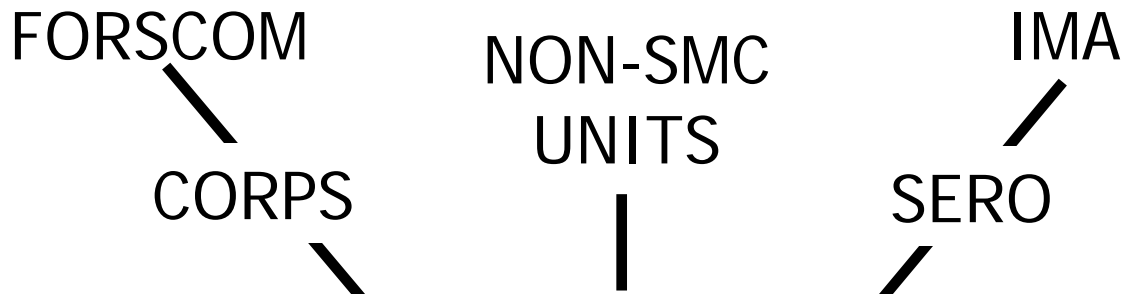
